The Bible teaches us to pray for the salvation of peoples that do not worship God in spirit and in truth. There are hundreds of Central Asian people groups that have little or no access to the good news of Jesus Christ. How do you pray for a people that currently has no access to the Bible in their language or to a Christian church, that may never meet a Christian, that lives in a remote place and speaks a little known language?
